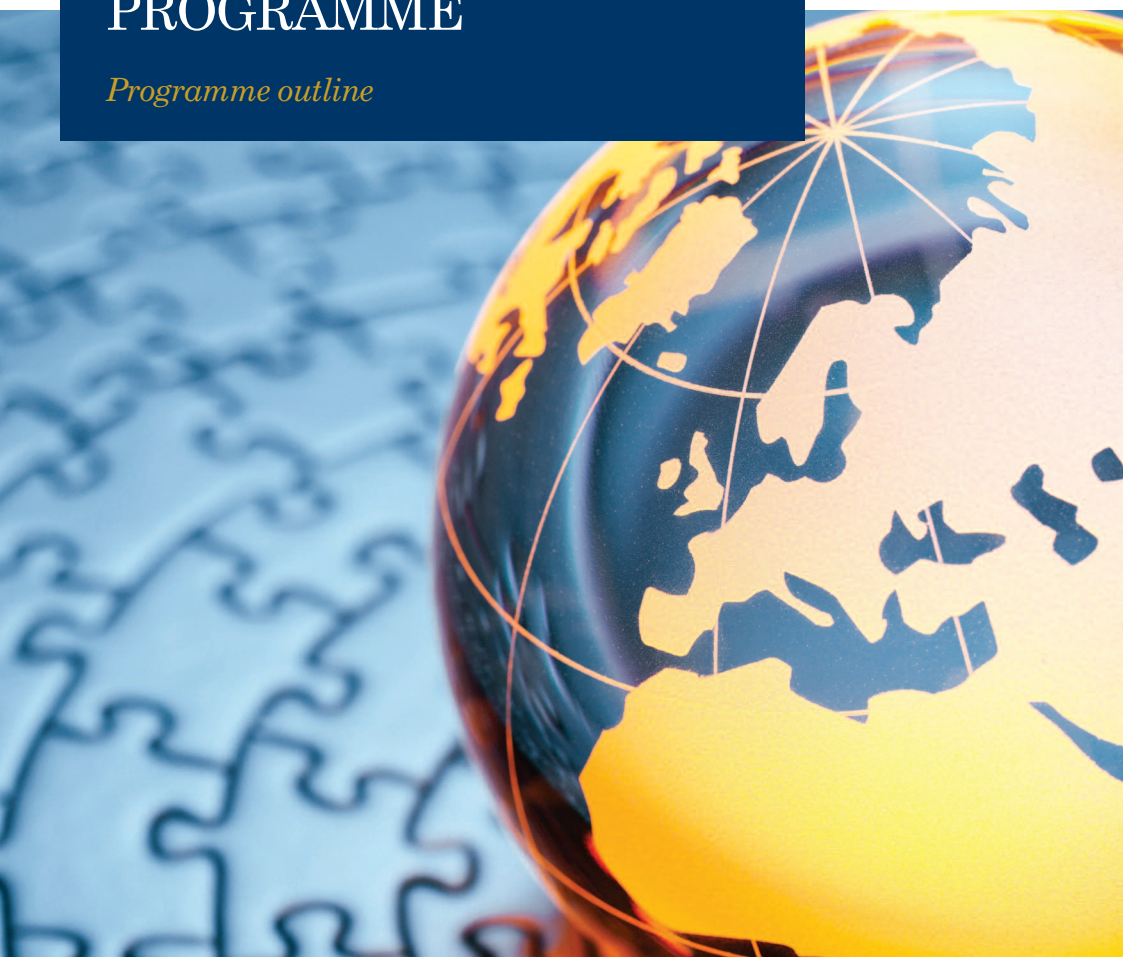

THE GLOBAL OFFICERS LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT (GOLD) PROGRAMME

What is the GOLD Programme?

The GOLD Programme is a co-curricular venture, which provides a framework of activities for globally-minded undergraduate students at Kent to develop their leadership skills, global citizenship and cultural awareness.

The programme responds to Kent's Internationalisation Strategy and aligns with the views of Gacel-Avila* (2005: 123) who states that a global consciousness needs to be fostered amongst students so as to help them to understand the interdependence between peoples and societies, to understand their own culture and those of others, and to develop a respect for pluralism.

What is the role of the Global Officer?

Global Officers will advise and assist the Dean for Internationalisation and staff across the University, engaged with internationalisation activity. Activities will include a range of internationalisation projects throughout the academic year. In particular, participants will support the promotion of events and initiatives and take part in focus groups to inform and lead on the development and review of certain internationalisation ventures.

Learning outcomes

During the programme it is intended that as a participant you will:

- deepen your international understanding and awareness
- be able to identify and develop your own cultural intelligence quotient
- develop leadership qualities and project management skills in a global context
- identify how to maximise the benefits of an international academic community
- learn, appreciate and evaluate different international perspectives
- enhance and apply your international communication skills in both verbal and written contexts.

Programme features

Duration: One academic year

Benefits:

- Employability Points awarded per activity
- Certificate of recognition and personal reference from the Dean of Internationalisation
- Recognition on Higher Education Achievement Report
- Practical event/project management experience
- A chance to record your international skill development in the Kent Global Passport

Requirements: It is a co-curricular programme and designed to fit around academic studies. The programme is made up of five components, which must all be completed:

Component 1: Getting started autumn check-in

You will be required to attend an introductory session where you will be introduced to the concept of cultural intelligence (CQ) and asked to reflect on your own skills and intercultural awareness. During the session, there will be a set of tasks designed to help you start to consider your current skill set and how it should develop in the context of the GOLD Programme.

You will also attend a Curriculum Internationalisation workshop. The session will aim to develop a common language and clarify key terms (such as internationalisation of the curriculum).

Component 2: Training workshops and spring check-in

You will begin to develop and enhance the skills you have identified at the start and will be supported with training workshops and a check-in, one of which will include a session off-campus.

You must attend at least two of the following workshops or sessions:

- Talking Cultures led by the Centre for English and World Languages – Canterbury
- Spring check-in session – Medway or Canterbury campus
- Leadership in the global context – off-campus (1 day)
- Event Management – Canterbury and Medway campus

Component 3: Internationalised student engagement

You will need to engage with the broader student body through various engagement and information exchange activities on campus.

You will be allocated engagement tasks which you will need to complete during the programme. These could include:

- Marketing and promotion projects with students on campus
- Participation in student media campaigns
- Focus group participation
- Orientation for new exchange students
- Campus tours for international visitors or delegates

Component 4: Project and event planning

You will need to put your training into action by engaging in the planning and delivery of existing on-campus activities and internationalisation events.

Based on your skills and preferences, you will be allocated events or project activities such as:

- Global Hangouts
- Worldfest Bitesize events
- Marketing of Worldfest
- Your own event

Component 5: Summer check-in and final review session

This will be an interactive group session allowing you the opportunity to reflect on your skills, identify your strengths and weaknesses, set goals and plan your own development activities after GOLD.

Application process

Eligibility: Undergraduate students at any stage of their studies.

Person criteria: Committed; enthusiastic; friendly; reliable; organised; professional
