- <u>Barker Oral History Tapes collection</u>: tapes chiefly made in the late 1960s to retain memories of life in Kent and elsewhere before WWI by UKC Economic History Department (with some made by local schools)
- The Hendrie Collection: comprises research papers, notes, and correspondence collected by Andrew Hendrie who completed his PhD 'Coastal Command 1939-1945: the Cinderella Service' at the University of Kent in 2004 and later published this as a book
- Lloyd George Collection: materials from the private library of the former Prime Minister David
 Lloyd George
- Modern First Editions and Modern Poetry Collections: published prose, poetry and diaries
- The Ronald A. Baldwin Collection: comprises material related to the history of Kent, covering subjects such as history, literature, religion
- The Winstanley Oral History Collection: interviews with over 160 people in Kent (mainly east Kent), recorded between 1974 and 1976
