





RESEARCHER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Graduate and Researcher College's Researcher Development Programme (RDP) is designed to equip postgraduate researchers and with a range of transferrable skills, which will improve their effectiveness when conducting research and increase their employability for a variety of careers.

The RDP complements research skills training delivered by academic schools and divisions, and offers over 250 workshops on more than 80 topics. Workshops are run by academics, professional service staff and external consultants, and can vary from 1-to-1 sessions to two-day workshops. Sessions provide the opportunity for researchers to interact with students from different departments, which can have beneficial outcomes for their research and development.

The Graduate and Researcher College organises Kent's Three Minute Thesis competition, which was developed by the University of Queensland.


Participating in the competition is a unique opportunity to develop your academic, presentation and research communication skills, and ability to explain your research to a non-specialist audience.
