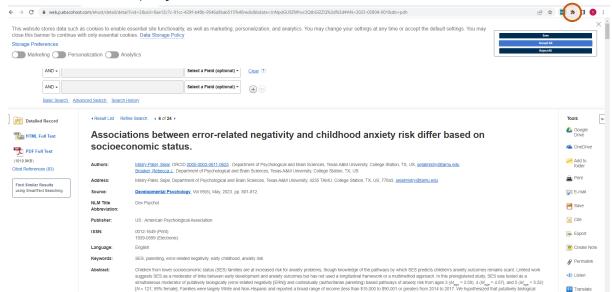
## Reading list guide

## Adding journal articles and other online resources

You do not need to be editing your reading list in order to use the bookmark tool.

- Find your online resource. For journal articles we recommend finding your article through LibrarySearch or one of the databases available through the library this is because Talis can only recognise items that have specific metadata attached and will not work with PDFs.
- When your chosen article has been opened click on the Talis browser extension: top right of toolbar.

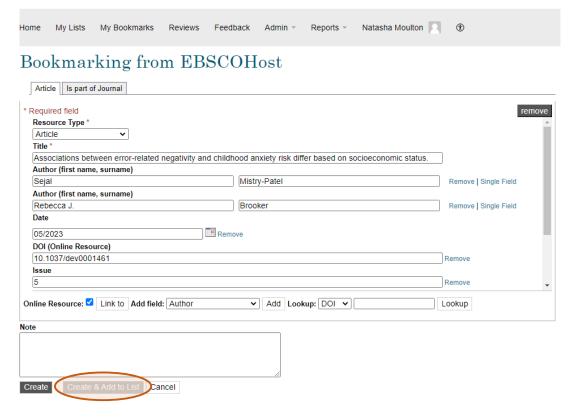


3 Important article data such as resource type, title, author & detailed metadata will then be displayed. If any information is incorrect or missing you can add data to these fields.

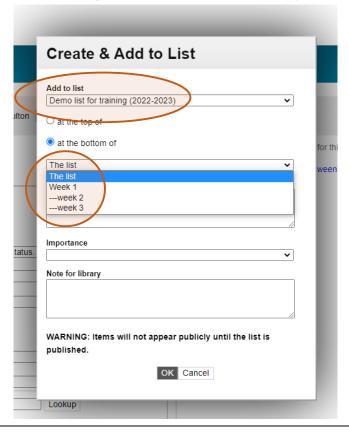




4 Select Create and add to list.



- 5 Select Name of the reading list.
- 6 Choose where on the list you want the resource to appear.





- Add an importance setting to indicate whether the resource is core, recommended or background reading.
- 8 Add any notes for students or library staff.
- 9 Select OK.
- 10 The resource will now appear in the chosen location on your reading list (you'll need to refresh the page if the list is already open).
