TV Licence Phishing Emails

Last week a Kent resident received the below fake email impersonating TV
Licencing. It was spotted due to the email address not being official, the fact that they addressed the person by their email address and not their name and the poor grammar. Additionally, it asked them to click on a link which is always a sure way to spot a scam.

If you receive suspicious emails, then forward them to Report@phishing.gov.uk

If you think that you may have been a victim of this or any other type of scam, then contact your Bank immediately, which you can do by calling 159 and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or call 0300 123 2040.
