# **Ofgem Phishing Email**

Action fraud have recently reported that they received over 750 reports about this phishing email which states that you are eligible for a rebate on your energy bill but need to click on a link contained within the email and disclose personal and financial information. It's a SCAM. The link will only take you to a genuine looking website, where the fraudsters will steal your details.

Remember, Banks and official organisations like Ofgem will never email asking you to click on a link to share this type of information. Forward suspicious emails to report@phishing.gov.uk

# Criminals target public with fake Ofgem emails

Action Fraud has received 752 reports in four days relating to fake emails purporting to be from Ofgem. The emails state that the recipient is eligible for a rebate as a result of a newly announced government scheme. The links in the emails lead to genuine-looking websites that are designed to steal your personal and financial information.

- · Your bank, or any other official organisation, won't ask you to share personal information over email or text. If you need to check that it's a genuine message, contact them directly.
- Spotted a suspicious email? Forward it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) - report@phishing.gov.uk
