


Support for care-experienced and estranged students thinking about university.

Starting university is an exciting time in your life: a new environment, new people and new experiences. Many students may feel a bit daunted when they first arrive, regardless of how confident they may appear.

At the University of Kent, we stand for ambition. We are committed to supporting students to access, succeed in and progress from university, regardless of their background. For young people leaving care or who are estranged, there are many practical elements to consider and we have put in place a range of support services specifically to address the needs of care-experienced and estranged students.



Who are care-experienced

either officially (eg a special guardianship order), or informally without local authority support.
A care leaver is someone who is, or has been, in the care of the Local Authority for

a period of 13 weeks or more, spanning their 16th birthday.

 An estranged student is someone who is studying without the support or approval of their parents due to breakdown in relationship.
