












WHY KENT?



Pre-sessional English courses

Our Pre-sessional courses prepare you for degree study in the UK. All our courses focus on developing your academic study skills and improving your English language proficiency.



Pre-sessional courses run for four, six, 10 or 16 weeks and, alongside English language tuition, cover:

- what it is like to study at a UK university and what is expected of students
- skills in academic reading, writing, critical thinking and using academic sources
- listening effectively in lectures and classes, and taking notes
- speaking in seminars and delivering presentations
- the IT systems and e-learning platforms used at Kent.

University of Kent International College

To increase options for all our international students, in 2024 in partnership with the Oxford International Education Group, we opened the University of Kent International College (UK IC).

UK IC is an embedded on-campus college on our Canterbury campus. Its building is close to the on-site student accommodation village, which puts you at the heart of campus life. You'll be a full member of Kent's diverse student community, able to access all the study, social, sports and support facilities the University offers.

Your options

International Foundation Programme

Start: January or September, 3 term **English Language Requirement:** IELTS 4.5 or equivalent (with no skill below 4.0)




This one-year programme caters specifically for the needs of international students, developing subject-



specific knowledge, while also focusing on improving your academic English language skills. Successful completion guarantees progression on to a range of undergraduate courses at Kent.

International Year Zero

Start: January or September, 3 term **English Language Requirement:** IELTS 5.5 or equivalent (with no skill below 5.5) Start: April, 2 term English Language Requirement:



The International Year Zero is the first year of a fouryear integrated programme. Your first year is taught at UK IC, where you'll gain additional skills in your chosen study route as well as the English language skills you need to excel in your studies. On successful completion of this year, you study the remaining stages of your degree at the University of Kent.

International Incorporated Master's

Start: June or September, 1 term **English Language Requirement:** IELTS 6.0 or equivalent (with no skill below 5.5) Start: January or April, 2 term **English Language Requirement:** IELTS 5.5 or equivalent (with no skill below 5.5)


The International Incorporated Master's (IIM) is designed for students who do not qualify for direct entry to a Master's degree. It focuses on equipping you with the academic English language skills and subject-specific knowledge you need to complete your postgraduate study at the University of Kent.
