The Graduate and Researcher College's Researcher Development Programme (RDP) is designed to equip postgraduate researchers with a range of transferable skills to improve their effectiveness when conducting research and increase their employability for a variety of careers.

The RDP complements research skills training delivered by academic schools and offers over 250 workshops on more than 75 topics. Workshops are run by academics, professional service staff and external consultants, and can vary from 1-to-1 sessions to two-day workshops. Sessions provide the opportunity for researchers to interact with students from different departments, which can have beneficial outcomes for their research and development.

We are always keen to receive suggestions from students for additional workshops and will do our best to provide these if there is sufficient demand.


Researcher Development Assessment (RDA)
