- A first- or second-class honours degree in a relevant subject or equivalent.

MSc Cognitive / Neuropsychology – MSc Developmental Psychology – MSc Social Psychology

- A first- or second-class honours degree in a relevant subject or equivalent.
- Proven familiarity with statistical and social science research methods in degree transcript.

MSc Applied Behaviour Analysis and Positive Behaviour Support – MA Intellectual Disabilities and Autism Studies

- A first- or second-class honours degree in a relevant subject or equivalent, and/or relevant professional experience (in the latter, applicants may be asked to complete an admissions and/or interview)

Entry Requirements - Taught

MSc Clinical Psychology – MSc Forensic Psychology

- A first- or second-class honours degree in a relevant subject or equivalent.
- An assessed piece of coursework, which includes the use of statistical analysis.
- Proven familiarity with statistical and social science research methods in degree transcript.
- Hold a Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership (GBC) with the British Psychological Society (BPS).
 - Normally held if your UG Psychology degree is BPS accredited
 - You can apply to have your UG degree assessed → *we'll support you through this!*
 - Or you can take a Conversion Course

Entry Requirements - Research

MSc (by Research) Programmes

- Confirmed project supervisor
- A Bachelor's OR Master's degree with:
 - A final degree classification of 2:1 or above in the UK system (2nd highest classification after First/Distinction).
 - Proven familiarity with statistical and social science research methods in degree transcript.

PhD Programmes

- Confirmed project supervisor
- A Bachelor's AND a Master's degree with:
 - A final degree classification of 2:1 or above in the UK system (2nd highest classification after First/Distinction).
 - Proven familiarity with statistical and social science research methods in degree transcript.

Accreditation

Professional recognition

- MSc Forensic Psychology – accredited by the **BPS**
- MSc Applied Behaviour Analysis and Positive Behaviour Support – accredited by the **Behavior Analyst Certification Board (USA)** and the **UK Society for Behaviour Analysis (UK)**
- MSc Organisational & Business Psychology – accredited by the **Association for Business Psychology**

An accredited Master's degree is the first stage to becoming a forensic or an organisational psychologist.

It permits graduates to continue on to supervised practice within their respective fields.

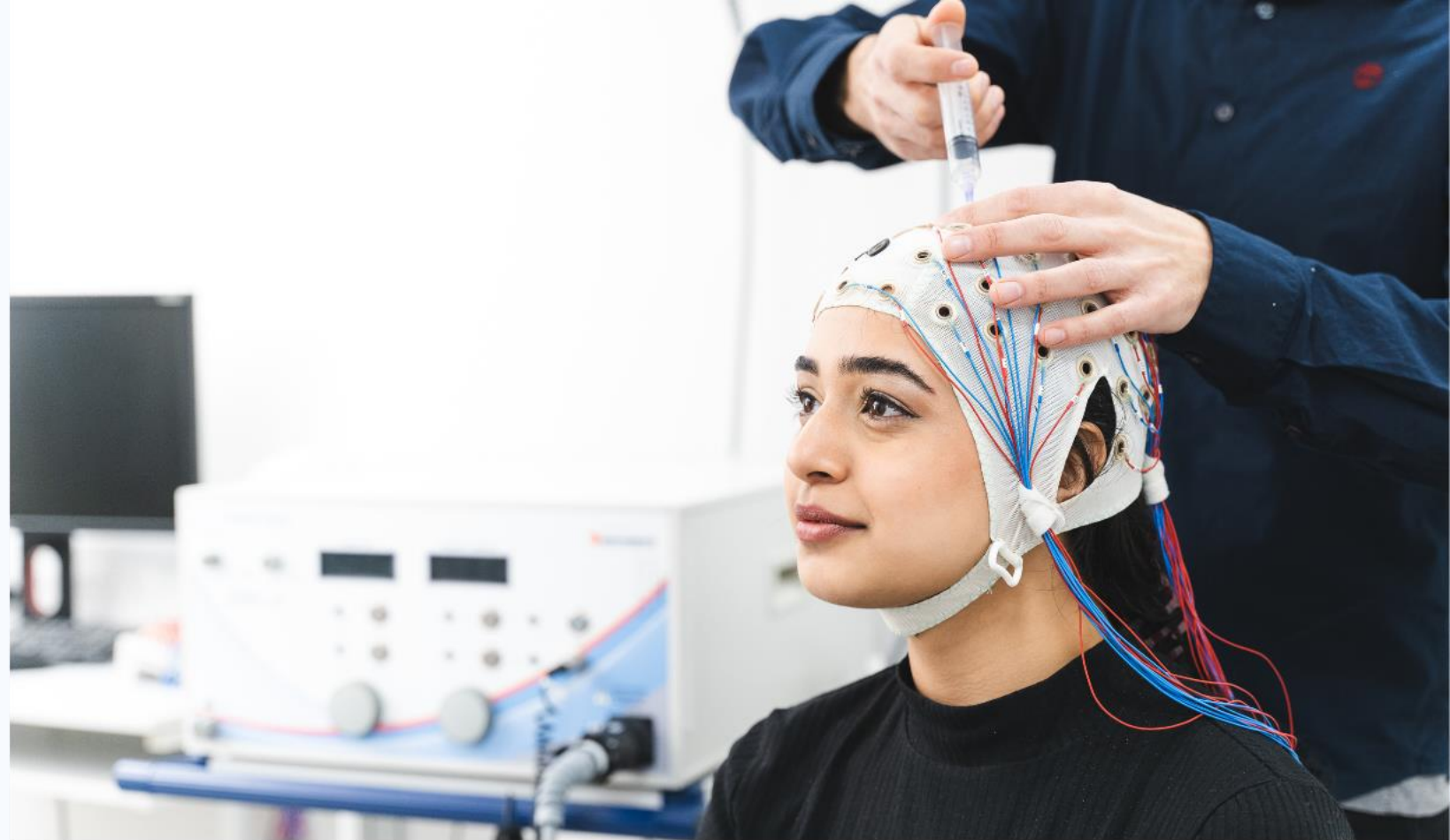
