Our Campus Wildlife

At the University of Kent we have a wide range of habitats that mean we are able to support over 1500 that use our site. These species range from ancient woodland plants like wood anemone to charismatic mammals like hedgehogs.



Recording Wildlife on Campus

Throughout the year, a variety of surveys are carried out to collect data on the wildlife that uses our campus. We collect data on everything from moths to plants to amphibians and mammals. One of the ways that we record wildlife at the University of Kent is through citizen science initiatives including through using iNaturalist. Through using this platform, anyone who comes onto our campus is able to participate in the recording of the species that live here.
