

# Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) Leader Job Description

## Voluntary Role

Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) is a student-led scheme where experienced students run informal group study sessions for Foundation or first year students. PAL supports students as they start university, helping them to build confidence, understand their subject more deeply, and settle into the academic environment. It also provides a welcoming space to meet others, ask questions, and feel part of the academic community.

The PAL scheme is offered in partnership with your academic School and [Skills for Academic Success \(SAS\)](#).

## Job Purpose

- Your role as a Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) Leader is to plan and facilitate small group sessions that encourage peer learning amongst your 'near' peers studying a stage below you on your course.
- To provide academic transition support, build confidence, a sense of belonging and help achieve success.
- You will guide and support students as they transition in their academic studies, build confidence in their subject understanding, and achieve successful study strategies, providing a sense of belonging and support them to become part of the student community at Kent.
- As a leader, you are **not expected to re-teach** content or provide answers on assignments, but to lead discussion in order to facilitate both collaborative and independent learning.

## Benefits of being a PAL Leader

- Receive formal recognition for your contribution to PAL, including employability points, a certificate, and the opportunity to enhance your LinkedIn profile with your experience.
- Develop key employability skills such as leadership, communication, facilitation and teamwork
- Enhance your confidence in supporting others and speaking in group settings
- Gain experience in planning and leading group learning sessions
- Build relationships with academic staff
- Strengthen your CV and prepare for future career opportunities

## Main Duties & Responsibilities

1. Attend induction events to promote PAL and work with your academic lead to support promotion with your academic school.
2. To schedule, plan, and promote PAL sessions to students, **ideally** in a small group setting.
3. To guide learning through semi-structured sessions, allowing for discussion of issues or concerns, and share positive experiences of their studies.
4. To signpost students to additional support or resources as needed (e.g., SAS study skills support; library services; student support and wellbeing; careers advice; Kent Students Union Advice Service).
5. To log students' attendance and topics covered by completing an attendance log after each PAL session.
6. To participate and encourage feedback on the PAL scheme by completing short surveys and scheduled forums.
7. You are expected to attend PAL monthly community meetings and one PAL team meeting per term.

### Application Process

1. **Complete an application by Friday 22 May 2026**
2. Your application will be processed by Skills for Academic Skills in partnership with your academic School.
3. Those shortlisted, will be invited to a short informal group interview w/c 1<sup>st</sup> June. Please make sure you are available and on campus as interviews will take place in-person.
4. Unfortunately, we are unable to provide feedback on your application to anyone who is not selected for interview.

### Next Steps

1. **You will be notified by 9<sup>th</sup> June, if successful, after interview.**
2. You will be required to complete mandatory training (online and in-person). Online training is expected to be completed over the summer. You will receive an email with instructions for how to book mandatory PAL training.
3. Once you have completed the mandatory training, you will be enrolled on the PAL Leader Moodle page.
4. You will be required to create your PAL Leader profile which will be shared and used to promote PAL in your school.
