RESEARCHER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Graduate School's Researcher Development Programme is designed to equip postgraduate and postdoctoral researchers with a range of research and transferable skills. The programme aims to improve their effectiveness when conducting research and increase their employability for a variety of careers by the end of their research project.

The Researcher Development Programme (RDP) offers over 200 workshops, covering more than 70 topics. This varies from one-to-one sessions to 2-day workshops, with some being Faculty specific and others cross-disciplinary. The workshops are run by academic and professional service staff as well as some external consultants. These sessions provide the opportunity for researchers to interact with students from different departments and backgrounds, which can have very beneficial outcomes for their research and development.

The RDP provision complements research skills training delivered by academic schools.

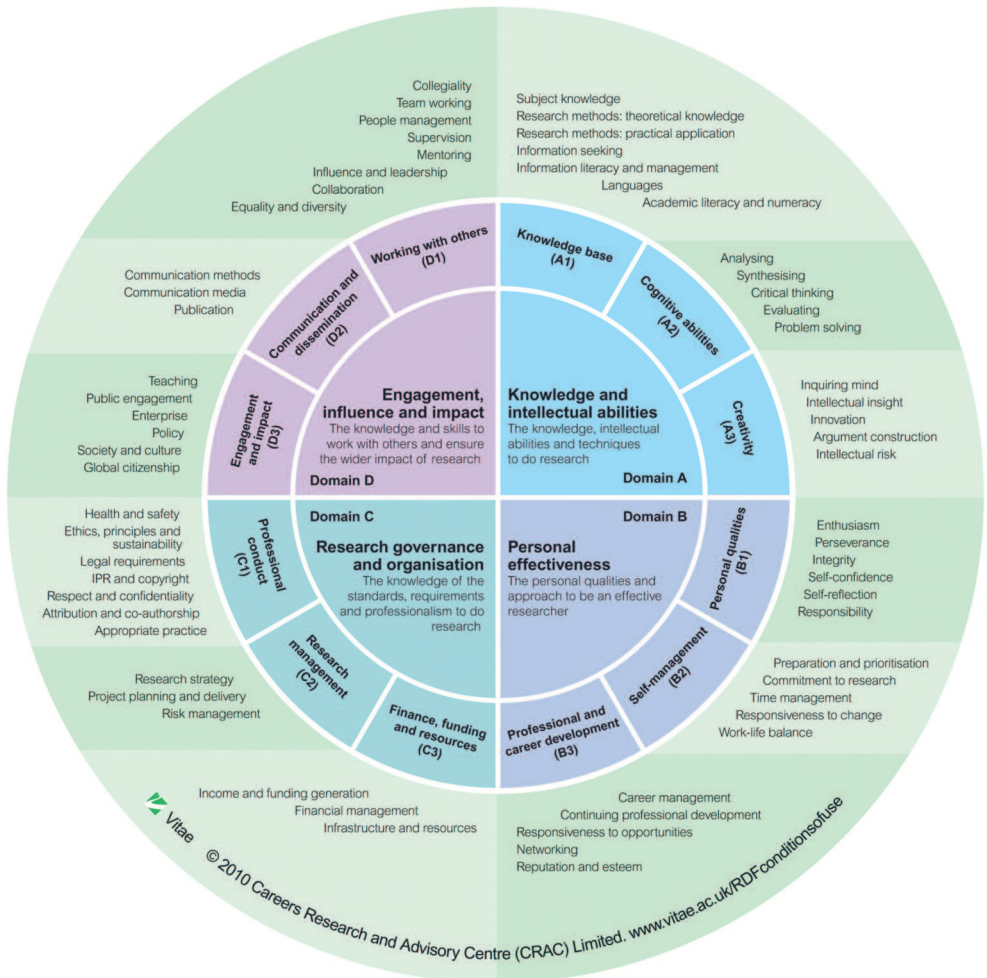
